### Facility Use Policy

SwimMAC is fortunate to be associated with Huntersville Family Fitness and Aquatics (HFFA) and have the use of its facility. Coaches, swimmers, and parents are to follow the procedures listed below.

### Drop off/ Pick up

Park in either parking lot when dropping off or picking up swimmers. If you want drop off or pick up your swimmers, please use the entrance facing Verhoeff Road. You may drop off swimmers 15 minutes before practice starts, but no earlier. Do not drop off at the side entrance in the parking lot. Please note that the speed limit in the parking lot is 10 miles per hour.

### Facility Access

Parents and swimmers may enter the building through any entrance. Swimmers must sign-in by using their SwimMAC key card. Parents, please sign-in at the front desk.

Swimmers must stay in the pool area or the locker room at all times. Parents are welcome to watch practice from the lobby or designated area on the bleachers.

**Non-HFFA Member Parents:** If you are not a member of HFFA, you and other SwimMAC family members must stay in the pool area or in the hallway outside the pool. You and your family members may use the swimmers' bathrooms in the locker rooms located in the hallway near the concession stands and vending machines. Other areas of HFFA are off-limits. All children should be closely supervised for their safety and as a courtesy to others.

**HFFA-Member Parents:** As a member of HFFA, you and your children may use the main HFFA locker room and must abide by the HFFA policies.

### Food or Drinks

Food or drinks (other than a water bottle for training) are NOT allowed in the pool area or locker rooms.

### Locker Rooms

Swimmers should leave the pool area and the locker rooms in condition as good as or better than they found them. Be sure to turn off the showers and faucets, take all belongings, pick up trash, and do not leave locks on the lockers. Use the same common courtesy you would use if you were a guest in someone else's home.
